Whereas, Gopher Tortoise Day will be observed annually Turkey Creek Sanctuary on April 10th, and

Whereas, the Gopher Tortoise has been living on the planet for 500,000 to 2 million years, and

Whereas, the Gopher Tortoise today is, in the State of Florida, protected and listed as Threatened, and in other parts of the Southeastern U.S., is Federally listed as Threatened, and

Whereas, the Gopher Tortoise is considered a Keystone Species, which means that if it were removed, the ecosystem that relies on its presence would drastically suffer, and

Whereas, the Gopher Tortoise's burrow provides habitat and refuge for more than 350 other commensal species, some of which are also listed as Threatened, and

Whereas, the Gopher Tortoise's habitat needs protection and restoration, and

Whereas, having Gopher Tortoises and other species in Turkey Creek Sanctuary, helps to sustain the area's ecology; and provide people with a source to treasure and appreciate our wildlife and natural heritage.

Now, Therefore, I, Tracey Wright, Park Ranger/ Naturalist of Turkey Creek Sanctuary, urge all citizens to protect this species through education and awareness; and hereby proclaim April 10, 2022, as:
